Fifteen middle school students and two teachers toured the museum last week as part of their Geology studies. The students are part of Mountain View School's English as a Second Language Program.

Because the students moved here recently from Honduras, Ukraine, Mexico, Nicaragua, and Haiti, (retiring Education Chair) Marsha Harmon and (incoming Education Chair) Susan Ray located in the museum those gems and minerals prevalent in each student's home country and made sure our guides Ron Rossomando, Karl Williams, and Marsha Harmon pointed the stones out to the student groups.

The students spent 90 minutes touring all areas of the museum, including the old jail cell and the Fossil Room – their two favorites! At the conclusion of the tour, each student was given a bag of various rocks, and the classroom received a large geode for permanent display.

Several area schools will have future field trips throughout the school year to the museum. Some of the schools, like Mt View, apply for and may be awarded FGMS scholarships to help offset field trip expenses which can be as much as \$300.

DMC Field Trip – Tuskegee, Alabama

On September 30th, Kathi and I joined 50 plus rockhounds in Tuskegee, AL for the DMC field trip to Uphapee Creek. Sponsored by the Montgomery Gem and Mineral Club, the day promised to be hot and dry. As we arrived at the Montgomery Club member's cabin parking was a little chaotic but we found a spot about 200 yards from the sign in station. Soon after we parked a young man in an ATV stopped by our car to chauffeur us up to the cabin. We signed in, received a raffle ticket, and were directed to the loading area where tractor pulling wagons transported us about a mile to the creek.

The creek was low, exposing 20 to 30 yards of river washed rocks from pea size to baseball size. The collecting area ran about a half mile along the creek allowing plenty of room for the numerous collectors. After a few minutes looking around, Kathi and I settled in a shaded area and started examining the rocks.

It was quickly evident that the majority of the rocks were collectable quartz of colors from dark red to brown. The club president told me that the majority of the rocks were washed down from a significant quartz bearing area resulting in carnelian, smoky quartz, quartz with tourmaline inclusions, as well as some petrified wood.

By 1:30 we had collected a bucket full of different shades and sizes of quartz and decided to call it a day.

While waiting for transport back to the cabin we ran into a member from the Cobb County Gem & Mineral Club who found a fantastic 2-foot-long petrified wood specimen. He was proud of his find but said that the memories of him and his 13-year-old daughter collecting today were the best part of the trip. Returning to the cabin we were treated to a meal of hot dogs, chili, drinks, and cookies. Kathi and I grabbed a couple of chairs under the shade to load up on food and drinks before the long drive home. It was then that the raffle began.

The Montgomery club had about 20 choice petrified wood specimens that were given out to the lucky attendees. The final grand prize drawing was for a 30+ pound petrified wood specimen that was won by a member of the Columbia, SC rock club.

Overall, it was a great day collecting, we met some wonderful folks, and the Montgomery Club members were tremendous hosts for this DMC trip.
