Minutes-May 25, 2017-General Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President, Tom Sterrett at 6:45 p.m. on Thursday, June 29, 2017, at the Masonic Lodge.

Membership – Ellen Crawford reported 47 members and 5 guests present.

<u>Minutes</u> – Tom Sterrett asked if there were any corrections or additions to the last minutes and there were none. Norman Holbert moved that the minutes be accepted as printed and Paul Thomas seconded the motion. Voted and carried.

<u>President</u> – Tom Sterrett announced that we will begin the Pebble Pup program next month and we will start off with giving them a tour of the museum. He also announced a change of dates for our next Board meeting and General meeting due to the July gem show. The Board meeting will be on July 18 and *the next General meeting will be July 20*. Working the Night Shift

Apprehending someone who is on the run is dangerous work and Sheriff J. Harry Thomas wasn't taking any chances when he got word that an escaped prisoner was hanging out in his jurisdiction. Sheriff J. Harry Thomas took his deputy Newell Pendergrass and enlisted the help of Franklin Police Chief C. D. Baird as part of a hunting party and went hunting on the evening of Thursday, July 14, 1955. Word had been received that an escaped prisoner been seen lurking about the Rose Creek Area, so a concentrated search was begun. Around 9 P.M. they caught up with and apprehended J. W. Grantan who had escaped from the Oconee County, Georgia prison camp.

The next evening, the 15th, the party reformed with the purpose of finding Fred Junior Bowers who was on attempting to elude officials in Alamance County, North Carolina. Fred Bowers was a Saxapaw resident who was wanted on a charge of Auto Theft. The party concentrated on the Cowee Community and the hunting was good. Fred Bowers was found hiding at the home of Harve Dills and around 9:30 P.M. he was taken into custody.

NOTICE FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Due to the increasing expense of printing and mailing the Society Newsletter each month, it has been decided that we must institute a charge for hard copies delivered via US Postal Service. Copies will remain free of charge when delivered via email.

This decision was made after much deliberation and a look at what other clubs charge for their news-letters. Other clubs have been charging a fee for several years as postal fees and cost of supplies have increased. In addition to that, our income in 2017 has been severely reduced by the lack of a Mother's Day Gem Show due to construction on the building where the show was to be held. We are taking this action in order to continue to have sufficient funds on hand to provide scholarships and other educational programs as required by our Mission of education. We hope that the members will understand that while the Society provides them with programs for enjoyment, it also has a higher function, in that we provide the community with educational services.

It is therefore with some sense of regret that we must announce that beginning with the October issue the cost of receiving a hard copy of the Newsletter via USPS will be \$25 per year in addition to the member's dues. This will apply to **all hard copies** sent out except those sent to other clubs that send us their own newsletter.


