## **Museum News: Update From the Museum Host Telephone Callers**

I guess by now you know that online Host Signup registration is no longer active. Now, you can either go into the museum to sign on the Hosting sheet or you can call the Museum phone (828-369-7831) during the hours from 12:30 to 3:30 and ask the person on call to sign up for the day/days of your choice. There are at least forty healthy-able bodied people -local persons in our club and there are only 20-25 days left that need hosting. Agreed, we need two hosts each day, but there are some dedicated persons who volunteer four or five times a month. May God reward them.

I have now been able to recruit two more persons who are willing to make calls on those days that do not have two volunteers. I, Charlene Galbrecht, will make calls for September, October, November and December; Tamara Zwinak will call persons for the months of January, February, March, and April; Doreen Freeman will call for the months of May, June, July, and August. If there is anyone else that

would like to make calls, we can have four callers making calls for three months or five callers making calls for 21/2 months etc. Just call me and I will be glad to add you to our list (954-263-8157).

There are some items I think we need to attend to:

I would like create a list of days that each healthy-able bodied -local person would like to Host and then we, the callers would only call you on your chosen days i.e., some persons work and are only available on the weekend. Some persons come from out of town and can only work certain months. I would also think it would be beneficial to know if you prefer to work the cash register or meet and greet the visitors or both, do you have a key to enter the museum, or do you need the door opened and closed for you, can you lift the welcome sign and carry it to Main Street, and can you climb the stairs.

For instance, I am healthy-able-bodied-local (most of the time), but I am not strong, and I have a bum knee, so I have to work with someone to carry the sign and climb the stairs. Thankfully, my husband Gary is willing to work with me. I also need to know that you have been trained. Ron Rossomando is available to train persons every Monday during the months he is local, but you have to register for the training, so he knows if he has any students. Sign up on the hosting sheet on a Monday. I think the caller position should be time limited to a two-year term, just as the other working positions are, but a caller can choose to extend the time if desired. I also think that the beginning dates should be staggered so that there are some neophyte callers and some experienced ones. Lastly, as a courtesy, if we do call you and you can or cannot come at the time we need you, please call or text us back with a response. Thank you for your time and your help.

# A Fantastic Mineral Collection in Vienna, Austria

Emperor Franz Stephan (1708-1765) of the Holy Roman Empire was a patron of the sciences. In his short life he acquired an extensive gem and mineral collection and established a botanical garden, a zoological park and a medical school. He sent explorers across the world, and especially to the Americas, to acquire specimens of minerals as well as plants and animals. After his death his wife, Empress Maria Theresa (1717-1780), made his collection the property of the State, opened it to the public, and hired a famous mineralogist, Ignaz von Born, to organize and expand the collection. Subsequent rulers continued to expand the collection throughout the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries.

The current Vienna Museum of Natural History was built in 1871-1889 of a size to display over 100,000 specimens. On the first floor, four exhibit rooms are reserved for gems and minerals and a fifth room for meteorites. The rest of the first floor houses an extensive fossil collection, prehistoric sculptures and artifacts, and exhibits documenting human evolution. The second floor contains a large collection of preserved animal specimens, from microscopic creatures through molluscs







(mollusks), insects, fish, amphibians, birds, and mammals. Less than 1% of the total museum collection is on display; the balance is available to scientists and guest researchers

The fifth exhibit room is devoted to meteorites, with about 1000 on display, most very small specimens
